Last weekend was the very successful Frankston Relay for Life with 26 teams and over \$57,000 raised in total for the event. Our team of 25 people raised over \$6,000 making us eligible for a Research Grant. I am going to choose Lymphoma/Leukaemia for our grant. Our Friend of Rotary, Penny Sayer and her team raised over \$8,000, so between our two teams we raised just over \$15,000 - a fantastic achievement.

Many thanks are due to Tony and Cheryl Carter for the donation to the catering of hot soup, which also raised \$410.00 to add to the total. I think we were definitely the best-equipped campsite with sofas and heaters and heaps of food provided by Cheryl and Nila Bird. Thank you both! We also had a few bottles of red to help keep us warm and a great time was had by all!

We intend to start our fundraising a
